Extra meeting held to discuss and agree a response to the proposed pedestrian crossing in the village.

The following was noted:

- The Community Council were disappointed about the lack of direct consultation from Bear Scotland. Action: *Hamish Fraser will write to North West Consultation to note our concerns.*
- COOP have developed their site to improve traffic flow and there were concerns that a Pedestrian crossing may again cause traffic congestion at a “pinch” area.
- Local businesses would be adversely affected due to delivery restrictions.
- The flashing speed signs in the village are not working and have never worked efficiently.
- The Community Council have always advocated more speed signs, especially flashing ones, to deter motorists from speeding rather than a pedestrian crossing which would affect traffic flow through the village.

Conclusion:

All present were in agreement that the Broadford and Strath Community Council are against the proposal for a pedestrian crossing in Broadford. The Community Council are disappointed by the lack of consultation from Bear Scotland and would like to meet with Robert Bruce to discuss effective traffic calming measures for Broadford. The traffic calming measures would not involve pedestrian crossings.
